#### Green Roading Notes

Yes, we have been green roading again, a small group of landies met at Basingstoke on 6th October. The group included two 'new' landies, Colin Gross's LWB safari that he has rebuilt from the chassis up, in fact he has rebuilt that as well; and (Red Leader) Dave's series 2, WOW as featured in last month's newsletter, he has bought whilst the long term rebuild of Toby takes place. Some may have seen Colin's LWB at the Wednesday meet at the Hinds Head; the engine was, I think, even cleaner than that in Andy Smith's P5B, but Andy slipped me a fiver to find some mud when we went green roading, so Colin's engine now looks like a'real' landie engine. Unfortunately I was not able to take my 2A Simmy as I was overhauling the gearbox ( seems like a possible article for the newsletter Rog --ed) and attending to the front brakes.

Our 0930 start was slightly delayed whilst Dave changed over wheels from road to off-road ( $\frac{1}{2}$  mm more tread) tyres; he actually has two complete sets of wheelsplus the set on Toby (what's a wheelsplus?) if things get bad!

We had decided that in the morning we would drive from green road section to green road section towards the Northwest and then have a longer green road drive in the afternoon back towards Basingstoke, that way the 'new' vehicles could get into green roading gently. We set off West to join the Harrow Way, then by road through St. Mary Bourne to join the Roman Road Northwest out of Andover. Along here we came acress 'Hampshire Gates' (we were ½ mile inside the Hampshire boundary ), these are simply wires put across rights of way by farmers to enable them to move animals from one field to another across the track easily, the wires have markers on them to stop you driving into them and also hooks so that they can be speedily taken down and replaced. We also met two walkers with dogs muttering that we should not be driving along the right of way- they had parked their car on the right of way, the car was a Reliant 3 wheeler...'nuff said.

We drove through Lower Chute towards a right of way heading up North towards Chute Causeway, unfortunately reconciling the tracks with the map revealed an overgrown 'white road', there were footpaths and bridleways leading to the right of way we wanted, but no obvious vehicular right of way ( shades of the church at Brown Candover!) so pending further investigation we retraced our tracks and then headed up North toward Shalbourne to join the track which would take us past Combe Gibbet. About 3 miles along the track we cut down to Ham for lunch.

So far we had only a few puddles and a few overgrown tracks as problems. Some of the tracks obviously hadn't been driven down for some time (ever?) and we decided on discretion for one track - we have a photograph of Colin walking out from the overgrown track looking pleased that he wouldn't have to drive through it!

The afternoon's drive was uneventful, a couple of narrow sections as we drove back towards the A34 North of Litchfield. I travelled as passenger then drove Colin's LWB, strangely enough it was the first time I have travelled in a LWB, it made light work of the fairly hard surfaces - difficult to believe we have had so much rain -it could even be described as , better whisper it..comfortable!!!.Colin has done a nice job of the rebuild, the engine is freeing up, and off the highway is now down in temperature to the cool side of boiling! no problems on the open road.

We retraced our tracks back along the Harrow Way and then back to Basingstoke before dark.
