Brick Kiln Farm, 18th December 1994

Let's start with thanks to those who worked in the rain on Saturday to lay out the sections. (Legal note:- Oh dear, I seem to be getting "heavy" straight away, but you must record your presence on site when you are setting up an event so you are covered by insurance. The event insurance will cover you for the day before an event even if that date isn't on the permit application form. A standard official's signing-on sheet will do) It continued to rain all night but was clear for most of the Sunday's event. That is, it was very wet and muddy. Many of the CCVT sections were laid out in and around the two mud pits but because of the difficulty, the RTVs stayed clear of this area until later on when a section had to be re-routed and headed inexorably towards the mud!!. Parts of this RTV section had been laid out over "virgin" soil contrary to the express wishes of the landowner. Now I'm not trying to criticise those who laid out the sections as this matter hasn't been mentioned to me before nor to any of those present; so somehow, the request didn't get through. Basically the message is "Please use the existing tracks - don't use the grassy bits with bluebells on. Thanks". There are also areas taped off where there are badger sets etc. - please keep clear of these as well. Our continued use of the site may depend on this.

The CCVT was very closely fought as the results show. There were some pretty close scores in the RTV as well. We had at least one first time competitor here in N. Van den Braak. We hope the level of difficulty didn't put you off; it's not always this hard! Ian Copplestone was trying out his recent class 10 aquisition, Gary Langton's 88" special, but we couldn't persuade Gary to enter in his new 101. Gary, Nick Jennings and Nick Woodage are building a joint CCVT vehicle so the CCVT side of the club is building up. Unfortunately, this means that there will be three less regular RTV entries. Alan Smith has now bought another 90 for this purpose so he can compete on a more regular basis rather than use his "Business" 90. If any members are dithering as to whether to have a go or not, come along to an event and ask to be a passenger in one of the competing vehicles. That way, you'll see what it's like from inside the vehicle on a real trial before going it alone.

This event was a round of the four-round Winter Trials Series. As mentioned in Pants and Barks before, each round will stand on it's own just like any other event complete with awards. We will be issuing framed certificates for a trial period (Pun intended - who could resist it?). If you get bored with looking at your certificates after a while, you can put photos in the frame instead! To qualify for a place in the Winter Series, you must attend all events, officiating in one (Marshal, Scrutineer, Secretary, Clerk-of-the-Course, etc.) and compete in the other three. A separate set of awards will be presented for the series when it ends.

The Saga of Steve's Fuel Tank. The Conclusion.

Yes, I ran out of fuel again with the gauge still happily reading ¼-full and no low-level warning light showing. I was prepared for it this time as I had plenty of spare fuel on board to top up and get me home. I'd gotten a good idea what the problem was likely to be by this time so I removed the tank carefully and lifted out the fuel pump and looked inside. I saw basically what I expected to see. The tank sender float was hung up on an internal baffle. When I'd fitted the sender unit from the side of the tank, the float slid along the floor of the tank beside the baffle. On power-up, the instrument panel gauge showed zero fuel and the warning light was on. On filling the tank, the float rose to a point above the baffle and swung over the top of it. When the fuel was used up, the float settled on top of the baffle giving a false reading. Rather than bend the arm, I unclipped the float and repositioned it from the forward side of the arm to the aft side where it wouldn't catch on the baffle.

Either this tank is different from the old one, or the float has always been on the wrong side of the arm and it simply didn't catch on the baffle on the old tank. Well, there you have it - lots of aggro and hard work for the simplest of problems.

Cry Freedom!

No, not a film about Africa but a new deal called Freedom from Land Rover Finance. Basically it's a method of buying a new Land Rover on a kind of hire-purchase / lease scheme. You pay an initial deposit and then make 24 or 36 monthly payments. At the end of the agreement you can:-

- Part exchange for a new Land Rover,*
- Make the final payment and the vehicle is yours,
- Hand back the vehicle with no more to pay.*

The buy-back price depends upon mileage. There are five annual mileage bands from 8000 to 25000 p.a.

Let's look at the example LRF give: a 2-door TDi Discovery on a two-year agreement in the 12000 p.a. mileage band.

Example on-the-road price £19365.
Required deposit (30%) £5809.50
24 monthly payments of £254.65. £6111.60
Final payment lump sum £10400
Total payable £22415.10

(I make that last figure £22321.10!)

At this point you take possession or LRF will buy the vehicle back for £13000* which means it will have cost you about £9k for two years use. Alternatively you can pay the £5809+£6111 over the two years after which you hand it back with no more to pay. That's about £12k for a two-year "lease". Is that expensive? What would a two year old Disco normally fetch?

The other point to consider is what happens to the returned vehicles that they're buying back for £13k? I contacted Land Rover Finance and they told me that the individual retailers will sell them as second-hand vehicles in the normal way. This means that there should be a supply of 2 or 3 year old vehicles that have been serviced properly and while they may well command premium prices, they should be a good deal. LRF also told me that they may set up a nationwide database of ex-Freedom vehicles so you can find exactly(ish) what you want.

* This is conditional on the vehicle having been serviced to LRs specification.

Road Taxed Vehicles

Are you thinking of having a go at RTVs? Do you need a vehicle to start with or a second one if your current vehicle is unsuitable? There are some real bargains in the "Vehicles for Sale" section.

There are a couple of Series IIs / IIIs in the £700 to £850 price range and above, or a Range Rover at £1750. For the ultimate experience, there's a 101 available too! Don't forget that the latter is a standard class leaf-sprung vehicle and qualifies for the Red Leader Shield. Whatever you get, it'll need to be taxed and insured but you'll not find a cheaper way in to any branch of motor-sport!

If you buy one of these or if you already have a "suitable" vehicle, the only change you may need to make to it is to establish suitable recovery fittings front and back, and fit an extra spring on the throttle linkage. If you've not tried anything like this before, come to an event and ask one of the competitors whether you can be a passenger.

CONSTITUTION OF THE HANTS & BERKS ROVER OWNERS

- 1. TITLE: The name of the club shall be the "HANTS & BERKS ROVER OWNERS" known as the HBRO and hereinafter referred to as "the club".
- 2. DEFINITION: In connection with the club, the term "Rover" shall refer to vehicles produced by The Rover Motor Company, The Austin Rover Group (and their successors) and any company in between bearing the Rover name, differently badged overseas models and vehicles produced by the Land Rover Group (and their successors).

OBJECTS:

- a) to further interest in motoring and motor sport.
- b) to provide members with information, advice and assistance on matters connected with motoring and motor sport.
- to watch the local administration of the laws and regulations affecting motoring and motor vehicles and to report any proposed local action or scheme to the RACMSA Ltd.
- d) to promote motor competitions in accordance with the rules of the RACMSA Ltd.
- e) to arrange tours, lectures, discussions and social and other meetings.
- f) to afford members such benefits and privileges as it may be possible to arrange.
- g) to assist and encourage members in the restoration, maintenance and use of Rover vehicles.
- 4. MEMBERSHIP: Ladies and gentlemen of not less than 14 years of age shall be eligible for membership. The membership categories shall consist of:
 - a) Honorary members.
 - b) Ordinary members.
 - c) Associate members.
 - d) Social members.
 - e) Provisional members.
- 5. MANAGEMENT: The authority and responsibility for the transaction of the business of the club for its management shall be vested in a committee, who in addition to the powers and authorities expressly conferred on them by these rules, may exercise all powers and do acts in furtherance of the objects for which the club is established, other than those hereby expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the club in general meeting.
- 6. ELECTION OF OFFICERS: Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and Committee shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting and, subject to termination of office by resignation, shall remain until the next Annual General Meeting following their appointment. The committee shall have power to co-opt other members as they deem necessary. The retiring officers and other members of the committee shall be eligible for re-election.

- 7. COMMITTEE: The committee shall consist of the Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and not more than two other members. Nominations for candidates for election to the committee may be taken at the Annual General Meeting. The Committee shall have the power to appoint a sub-committee of not less than three persons to meet on its behalf in respect of any matter which is specifically referred to such a sub-committee.
- 8. MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE: The Secretary, either of his own accord or by the direction of the Chairman shall, unless otherwise agreed by all the committee, give at least seven days written notice of a meeting.
- 9. ABSENCE FROM COMMITTEE: Any member of the committee who is absent from three consecutive committee meetings without sufficient reason, may be called upon to resign his position from the committee.
- 10. DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY: It shall be the duty of the Secretary to attend in person or by deputy, all meetings of the committee and to take minutes of the proceedings, such minutes shall be recorded and presented for confirmation at the following meeting.
- 11. BANKING: All monies of the club shall be banked by the Treasurer in the name of the club and no disbursements shall be made there-from except in accordance with the form or forms authorised by the committee. However small amounts of cash may be retained by the treasurer for petty cash, provided the amount does not exceed 10% of the club funds or £100 whichever is the lesser amount.
- 12. ELECTION OF MEMBERS: Application for membership of the club by candidates shall be submitted to the committee. The application is to be accompanied by the appropriate subscription, which will be returned if the membership application is rejected and the election of such candidates shall be at the discretion of the committee. All applications must be made by an individual in his or her own correct name and be signed by the said applicant personally. Applicants for ordinary membership will, after election, become Ordinary members.
- 13. ASSOCIATE MEMBERS: An associate member is one who is:
 - a) The spouse of an Ordinary member, or
 - b) accepted as a special case by the committee.

Associate Members may participate in club events, they have no voting rights and other than notice of renewal of membership, will normally receive no official correspondence.

- 14. SOCIAL MEMBERS: Social members may attend club meetings and participate in club events as passengers, they have no voting rights and other than notice of renewal of membership, will normally receive no official correspondence. They must be personally known to an ordinary member of the club.
- 15. PROVISIONAL MEMBERS: Any candidate for membership of the club whose subscription has been accepted shall become a provisional member of the club. Provisional membership of any member shall only hold good until the meeting of the committee after payment of the subscription of such candidate. Provisional members may participate in club events but have no voting rights.
- 16. VOTING BY COMMITTEE MEMBERS: Each Committee member present at a committee meeting shall be entitled to exercise one vote. The committee shall vote by ballot if any member present so demands. A vote of one third against any applicant for membership shall exclude him from membership. No collective voting shall be allowed. Proxy voting shall be accepted.

- 17. SUBSCRIPTIONS: To be decided at each Annual General Meeting
- 18. MEMBERSHIP: Membership shall last for twelve whole months from payment of subscription. However, Associate Membership shall be coincident with the relevant Ordinary Member.
- 19. NON-PAYMENT: Any member of the club who has not paid his subscription by the date it become due, shall be notified of the fact in writing and one month thereafter any member who has still failed to pay his subscription shall, unless sufficient reason be shown to the satisfaction of the committee, be taken off the register of members forthwith. No member whose subscription is in arrears shall be eligible to take part in any competitions organised by the club.
- 20. RESIGNATION: Any member wishing to resign his membership shall give notice in writing of such a desire to the Secretary on or before the date on which his subscription would become due for renewal in any year. Also, any member ceasing voluntarily or otherwise to be a member of the club shall thereafter cease to have any claim upon the property of the club or to enjoy the privileges of membership, but he or she shall remain liable for any debts due to the club from him or her
- 21. USE OF THE CLUB NAME AND ADDRESS: The name and address of the club shall not be given by any member as his address for trade, advertising or business purposes or in connection with any legal proceedings.
- 22. HONORARY MEMBERS: At the absolute discretion of the committee, a member may be elected and remain an Honorary Member and be exempt from payment of annual subscription for as long as the committee may decide. Honorary Members may participate in registered competitive club events with the written permission of the RACMSA Ltd but will have no voting rights.
- 23. EXPULSION OF MEMBERS: It shall be the duty of the committee if at any time they shall be of the opinion that the interests of the club so require, by letter to invite the member to withdraw from the club within a time specified in such a letter and in default of such withdrawal to submit the question of his expulsion to a meeting of the committee to be held within six weeks after the date of such letter. Members of the committee shall be given at least seven days notice that a question of withdrawal or expulsion is to be discussed at a meeting of the committee. The member whose expulsion is under consideration shall be given at least seven days notice of such a meeting and shall be allowed to offer an explanation of his conduct verbally, or in writing and if a majority of the committee members shall then vote for his expulsion, he shall thereupon cease to be a member of the club.
- 24. THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING: The Annual General Meeting of the club shall normally be held in the month of October in each year upon a date and at a time to be fixed by the committee. The Annual general Meeting shall:-
 - Receive from the committee a full statement of accounts duly audited showing the receipts and expenditure for the year ending.
 - b) Receive from the committee a report of the activities of the club during the said year.
 - Elect the Chairman, the Secretary, the Treasurer and the committee members of the club and two auditors
- 25. SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING: A Special General Meeting may be convened by direction of the committee, or on a requisition to the Secretary stating the business for which the Special General Meeting is required and signed by not less than twelve ordinary members. If the meeting so requisitioned is not convened within thirty-five days, the said twelve members may

convene such a meeting. Fifteen ordinary members shall form a quorum.

- 26. AGENDA: When mernbers wish a matter to be discussed at a general meeting, the text of such matters signed by at least two members shall be sent to the Secretary at least fourteen days prior to the date of such meetings so that it may be included in the agenda, together with matters which the committee wish to discuss. A copy of the agenda shall be sent to each member at least five days prior to the meeting, but the fact that any member has not received a copy of the agenda shall not invalidate the proceedings. Should the proposer of any motion fail to move such a resolution in respect of the relevant item on the agenda, then any other member shall be entitled to do so.
- 27. VOTING: Only Ordinary Members may vote, every Ordinary Member may exercise one vote. The Chairman shall not vote except in the exercise of a casting vote. At all general meetings, a majority of votes except as provided in rule 30 decides a resolution. At any general meeting any twelve ordinary members may demand a poll and thereupon the meeting shall be adjourned to a time and place to be named by the chairman and a postal vote shall be taken of all ordinary members of the club. The decision of the members, as shown by such postal vote, shall be reported to the adjourned meeting and shall be deemed to be the decision of such meeting. The rules relating to collective voting and proxies shall apply as rule 16 hereof.
- 28. RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE: No-one can take part in general meetings unless he has been duly elected as a member of the club and has paid his subscription according to these rules.
- 29. OBSERVANCE AND INTERPRETATION OF RULES: Every member binds himself to abide by the rules of the club and also by any modifications thereof made in conformity with such rules and also to accept as final and binding the decision of the committee in all cases of dispute or disagreement as to the interpretation of these rules.
- 30. ALTERATIONS OF CONSTITUTION: Any alterations of the Constitution may be made by a general meeting provided that the details of the proposed alteration or alterations are included in the notice of the general meeting and that the resolution proposing such alteration is carried by two-thirds of those present and voting at such general meeting, or by two-thirds of those voting should a poll be demanded as provided in Rule 27.
- 31. EVENTS: All motor competitions organised by the club shall be held under the rules and requirements of the RACMSA Ltd. Any member convicted of an offence arising out of being in charge of a motor vehicle in any club event or on any club business shall thereupon be liable to expulsion from the club under Rule 23.
- 32. COPIES OF CONSTITUTION: Every member shall be furnished with a copy of the club constitution on election.
- 33. BADGES OF OFFICE: Any badges of office issued to a member by or for the club shall remain the property of the club. On termination of his membership, members shall deliver up such badges to the secretary.
- 34. DISSOLUTION: The club may be dissolved by a special general meeting convened by direction of the committee, or on the requisition of the majority of the members. If the resolution of dissolution be duly passed, the committee shall forthwith liquidate the affairs of the club and if there be any surplus assets on realisation, these shall be disposed of at the discretion of the committee.

RTV & CCVT Trials at Nellies Dell February 19th Winter Series, Fourth Round.


