
Events for Your Diary

Interesting and thought provoking article in the mag about future vehicle regulations!!

You asked for comments so here are a few that sprang to mind.

1. Section A (5) Air filters.

If the filter & housing are free, so long as the housing remains in the same place, does this mean that K&N type filters will not be acceptable?

Section F (1d) Nudge bars.

"The bar must be made of tubes" Are tubes round or does square or rectangular box section constitute a tube ?

3. Section F (1j) Winches etc.

Does a winch bumper come with in the scope of this rule?

Response:-

- 1 I reckon it means that you can't have a remote filter assembly. If the original housing was on top of the engine, then the replacement one must be there too, regardless of its shape or make.
- According to the Oxford Dictionary, a tube is specifically cylindrical and used for carrying air or fluids. In engineering terms that's a **pipe**; a **tube** is a structural item and certainly can be rectangular. The terminology is quite specific, like the difference between a bolt and a screw or a fuse and a fuze. Note that most nudge-bars have flat plates in their construction too, so where does that leave us?
- The rules don't say that you can change the bumper, so you can't. Conversely, you could argue that the bumper is the mounting system that enables the winch to be fitted without modification to the structure of the car. It's an interpretation matter and may depend on the scrutineer on the day. "So no change there then!"

I'll take your queries forward to the scrutineering committee for clarification. But it does show how hard it is to produce what is intended to be a simple set of rules!

Bagshot Show went well, with HBRO as the lead Club, and I know that Chris Jones the organizer was very complimentary to our marshaling and organization, so thanks to all who participated, and apologies to those who unfortunately didn't get a Sweatshirt. One problem did occur, involving a back injury to someone seated in the rear of a Series one. The circumstances are still be investigated, however it does draw to our attention the danger for passengers who are not cosseted by comfy seats and restrained by seat-belts. We must be conscious of this at future events. The injured party fortunately suffered serious bruising and has recovered well, but did spend several days in hospital.

Off-Road driving day & Trials at Slab was a tremendous success for the Club. It was mud, glorious mud, but everyone appeared to thoroughly enjoy themselves, despite the almost continuous recovery programme. Many entrants commented on the professionalism of the marshals and the effectiveness of the organisation. Everyone who participated should give themselves a pat on the back, well done!! Thanks to Bob and the Bedford RL, without whom some vehicles could still be embedded in the pit now!!

We did unfortunately have a repeat of the incident at Bagshot, a second back injury. This time involving a coil-sprung vehicle and a passenger seated in the rear. The injured party was admitted to hospital briefly and retired home with pulled muscles and severe bruising. Again the circumstances are being investigated, but my worry is that the RACMSA will impose more rigorous regulations on this type of event, and we need to find a way of preventing these accidents in the future. We have been lucky in that both accidents did not result in a more serious injury, however I am concerned that the next time could be the one that either results in a major medical emergency, or questions the diligence of our marshaling. I am planning to ask St. John's to attend all Scenic drives in future, but I would appreciate any thoughts, inputs or suggestions on this matter.

The IOW trial went well, and Martin Parsons is planning further events, and will let HBRO know dates when confirmed. Sorry about the short notice on this event, but unfortunately we didn't t know until the Slab event that it was on -blame Martin. How about a summer trial on the IOW - Martin??

Fire training was held at Thruxton, and again the comment was; how useful this experience is to anyone who has not experienced the use of the different types of extinguishers and their application. Although this exercise was

focused on vehicle fires, it's very helpful in understanding the principles of dealing with other types of fires.

Another event that escaped the HBRO calendar, the Longleat Off Road weekend (25/26.10) which we found out about a couple of months ago, but didn't get invited to until 1 week before the event, when Marshals were needed. Sue Lea, Gary Hodgson and myself attended, and it appeared to go well. I was impressed with the new Toyota Landcruiser, and the Off Road Course through the Lion's enclosure. Sorry, I couldn't call everyone, ran out of coins for the phone.

AGM was on Friday 31 October and was switched to Nelly's for the convenience of members camping there for the weekend. The idea was good, but as it was freezing and we had to erect the Marquee, it may be better to switch to the Lawns next year. Fortunately Alan arrived with two Calor heaters, both of which have been voted onto the committee for saving the day. The minutes of the meeting will be published in P & B.

Nelly's Bonfire special and BBQ went with a bang, actually several bangs!! Food was great, thanks Maxine and helpers. Bonfire burned well, thanks Barry, Gary et al for preparation and particularly Barry for clearance and disposal of remains. I managed to avoid Fireworks going-off in the back of the Disco this year, but still had to take rapid avoidance action for some of these sneaky Chinese jobs.

1997/1998 Winter Series is now underway, and for those new members, a quick repeat of the rules: The series comprises 5 RTV events normally running from November through March, although if we lose an event due to inclement weather or loss of a site (this will apply as the Broxhead event in December will not feature a trial), the series will extend to April. Entrants must compete in 3 events, and marshal in one. One event can be missed. If 4 events are entered, the lowest 3 scores will be used to compute the overall winner.

The first event, Nelly's Dell on (2.11), has already taken place, but as one event can be missed, there is still a chance to compete and win, so let's be having you!! Nelly's Dell was a very good turn-out, and Kiran Raval (CoC), and his team managed to create some new twists and turns on the site which everyone enjoyed. Thanks Kiran and all the officials for the day. Results detailed elsewhere.

Broxhead 97 takes place on the 14 December, and will feature another scenic drive, fun sections, Quad bike demos, and a visit by Santa (well that's the rumour!), so bring the kids, and the children. Following the success at Slab, the idea is to construct a scenic drive course, with a series of FUN challenges, arranged as sections around the route. The entrants will then travel the route, entering the sections, and attempting the challenges. These sections cannot be scored but each successful attempt could result in a token which could be used in exchange for a can of WD40 or ?? . Ideas on a postcard please. We would like 10 sections, and therefore 10 groups of members, each to conceive and run a challenge. Volunteers please. The intention is that ALL members participating should also take it in turns to 'run the gauntlet' and attempt the challenges.

Remember the challenges must be safe, but could be graded by entrant, e.g., novice in brand new disco with impending Turbo/Gearbox/Head Gasket failure, OAP in blue trialler, Flash Gordon in Truck Cab 90 etc., etc.. Teas, Coffees provided free to officials - what a bonus!! (Max is planning refreshments). Hey, what about fancy dress!! Well it is Xmas!!

Clearance day at Ashpark on 27 or 28 December is being planned, but as this is still to be confirmed, can anyone interested please call me for details during December.

Green laning trip along the Ridgeway is on the cards for 1st January 1998. Contact Dave Ridden, or Nick Jennings for details.

An early January Trial is being arranged at Brick Kiln for the 4th January. CoC will be Alan Smith. Please check with Alan or myself to conform all is OK, prior to the event.

A late January Trial has been arranged at Surrey Saw Mills on 25 January. CoC will be lan Parker. Kiran is arranging camping on the site for the Winter enthusiasts.

Rickshaw Ramble has moved to 13-15 February 1998. The Ramble for the uninitiated, is a Services event, which HBRO assists in the running. The event is set-up on the Friday, and runs during the day on the Saturday and over the Saturday night / Sunday morning. The activities include: Off-Road Sections, Timed Safari, Night navigation and Scatter. HBRO provides marshals for the activities. The location for the event is Weaver's Down, and surrounding areas, close to Longmoor camp, all renowned for their excellent Off Road driving terrain. Camping over Friday and Saturday nights will be available. Passes will be issued in advance, (and access to the site will be limited only to those with passes), and I will arrange specific activities for each marshal prior to the event. This is being done to avoid some confusion experienced at previous Rambles. I will need to have a complete list of volunteers by the 6 February 1998.

Looking ahead further, I am planning for another scenic drive / trial day at Slab on 1 March, Ashpark over Easter, with camping, and an inter-Club trial at Broxhead on the 11th May as a National Rally warm-up. Further dates will be issued in the Club calendar next month.

ARC National Rally 1998 is quite a different affair from the past events, as you should have now realised from the application forms. Any comments on the programme, or how you are planning to attend, e.g., one weekend, two weekends, all week, would be useful to see if we can co-ordinate our trips with other Club members.

The AWDC has asked HBRO if the Club would be willing run one or two of the stages at the Southern Hill Rally in 1998. This involves all aspects of the stage, including control, marshalling, timing etc.. Anyone interested, if you could let me know asap, so that I can determine whether we can support their offer. In addition they have asked if we would be willing to raise sponsorship for the sections we run, so any ideas on this would be appreciated.

Promotional Event


Broxhead Common, Dec 14th

There will be limited catering and toilet facilities.




RTV Trial Brick Kiln Farm. Alton. lanuary 4th

It is with deep regret that we have to report the death of Major Ben Hervey-Bathurst OBE, at his home at Eastnor on Saturday 18th October.

In 1960 he heard of the Land Rover Engineering Department's requirement for somewhere scoret' to test its new 129" Land Rover, and offered his services via a mutual friend. From this simple offer of help blossomed a friendship which spanned 37 years and which transformed Eastnor Estate into a world-renowned mecca for Land Rover testing

As a direct result of this contact, the then Midland Area of the 'original' Land Rover Owners Club was invited to camp in the Deer Park, and thus Eastnor also became one of the prime sites for Land Rover Club activity

Known universally as "The Major", he was an enthusiastic and skilled Land Rover user and 'salesman', but he always liked to keep our feet on the ground by having a hill that we couldn't climb! Once we did climb it, he would go away, get out the D8 Caterpillar, and cut a new onel

He loved to see people enjoying the countryside and to see Land Rovers doing what they were designed to do, and was ever the perfect gentleman. We were proud to have him as a Patron of the ARC
