

## Nick's Bit's

In the last few months, the nearest we have got to a club meeting, other than Pam Duffett's BBQ and the two pub meets, was the **Camel Trophy!!** On Sunday the 29<sup>th</sup> April, HBRO were invited to participate in towing the rigid inflatable boats used in the last two Camel Trophy events, from Lee on Solent to Hastings Pier. Around forty HBRO club members with various vehicles ranging from Series Motors, Ninetys, 110's, Disco's, Range Rovers, a couple of 101's and one member even turned up in a Land Rover "Pretender" for more details contact Andrew Bridger. Mind you, this isn't the first time one of these "Pretenders" has turned up at a Land Rover event; I seem to recall one at the 2000 Belgium Nationals!! (which is an all Land Rover event). The members were asked to arrive at Lee on the Solent in plenty of time to get themselves organised for a prompt start at 9am. Sue and I were up at 6am in order to put direction signs out for those who did not know the area. However, we were not up early enough because two members were already in front of us. We met Trevor Jones coming the other way, already having been sightseeing along the seafront! We quickly flashed our lights and he turned around to follow us. Johnny Boys gave everyone a driver's briefing and the convoy left on time at 9am. On leaving the parking area, we heard on the CB that one of the trailers had fallen off the back of a Land Rover. Yes a yellow 90, one with stickers etc.etc. well that must be Stuart! The things some people will do just to get a mention in the club magazine. Fortunately no damage was done, except to Stu Davidson's pride. That was soon sorted and the convoy was on its way. For safety reasons it was an open convoy, with the vehicles becoming quite spread out. We had back up vehicles bringing up the rear, just in case of a puncture or breakdown. The journey was very smooth, with no problems at all. There wasn't any specific order in the convoy, although with hindsight maybe it was a bit unkind to have the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary V8 90 following the 2¼ series III station wagon. I believe that after a couple of 20mph hill climbs the V8 stretched its legs and disappeared over the horizon!! Our 300 TDI 90 towed impeccably, (as always). I found I could just pull top gear at 45mph, and rarely exceeded 50mph, I estimated that the boat was considerably less weight than our caravan, and I normally cruise at 60mph with that! The first vehicle arrived at Hastings Pier at around 11.40am (us) and the last around half to three quarters of an hour later. Johnny Boys paid £30 to the drivers of the Diesel vehicles and £45 to the Petrol vehicles. Lunch was also provided for those who wished to stay. Sue and I didn't stop as we had the dog on board who needed a walk and we still had to drive back to Lee on the Solent to collect the direction signs back up. I think the members who took part were pleased to be doing something as a club and enjoyed the day out.

Pam Duffett did her best to organise a camping rally for Easter, but due to circumstances beyond her control this did not take place. However, not put off by this, Pam had another go, due to the cancellation of the ARC 2001 Nationals

on the Whitsun Bank Holiday. (The ARC Nationals is a time when many club members get together not only to compete but also to camp together and socialise. This event is a highlight in the club's calendar and was sadly missed this year.) Pam Duffett kindly said she would organise a camping rally. This was held on the rally field of a small commercial campsite near Salisbury. I am sure everyone who went had a great time, and there will probably be reports and photos about this event appearing in a future mag. Nick Jennings was active again providing the meat for a BBQ, which Pam cooked. So many thanks Pam and Nick J.

New cases of FMD do seem to be on the decrease, so let's hope there is an end in sight. Keep checking the Web Page for up-dates. As soon as we get the go ahead from the official authorities, we will start organising off-road events again. I must stress, that the clubs off-road events, cannot resume until both the MSA and the ARC allow it!


# Static Vintage & Classic Aircraft and Vintage Vehicle Display Vallance Byways Summer Show June 23/24 2001



## **LAND ROVER NEWS**

### **LAND ROVER WINS TWO QUEEN'S ENTERPRISE AWARDS - 21 April 2001**

Gaydon, Warwickshire, 21 April, 2001 -- Land Rover has been granted two Queen's Awards for Enterprise – for International Trade and for Innovation.

The Queen's Award is an accolade granted to companies by royal permission and is conferred on the Queen's birthday. Receipt of the awards will allow Land Rover to use the emblem for the next five years.

Land Rover's heritage goes back to the launch of its first vehicle in 1948. Land Rover is the world's

only company producing exclusively full-time 4x4 off-road vehicles and employs more than 11,000 people in the Midlands. Land Rovers are manufactured in Solihull and the company's corporate headquarters, engineering and design facilities, are at Gaydon in Warwickshire.

The Queen's Award for Enterprise for International Trade rewards the company's continuous expansion across the globe. Land Rover, which was purchased by Ford Motor Company in July 2000, exports around 77% of production to more than 140 markets worldwide. In the last five years, exports have more than doubled, to £2.48 billion.

The Queen's Award for Enterprise for Innovation recognises the revolutionary Hill Descent Control on the Land Rover Freelander and Discovery. This system automatically slows vehicles on steep off-road descents improving safety and control. Hill Descent Control continues Land Rover's long history of technical innovation in 4x4 vehicle design.

Bob Dover, chairman and chief executive officer of Land Rover, said: 'I am delighted to receive the news that Land Rover has been granted the Queen's Award for Enterprise for both International Trade and for Innovation. I can think of no greater way of recognising the efforts of everyone at Land Rover, in leading the world in 4x4 technology.'

Land Rover's production was more than 170,000 units last year and levels are set to increase significantly over the next five years. Key growth markets for the future include Japan and North America, where the new Freelander V6 is launched later this year. Since the acquisition by Ford Motor Company, Land Rover has invested heavily in the Solihull site, with £130 million earmarked by the end of this year.

## **A.R.C. COUNCIL 12<sup>th</sup> MAY 2001**

### **Foot and Mouth Disease – Competitive events and Caravan permits**

A.R.C. Council has carefully reviewed the Association's position on Foot and Mouth Disease and in the light of the continuing reduction in the number of cases, revised government advice, changes in the Motor Sport Association's stance and the position of other similar bodies on camping and caravanning has decided to issue the following advice to member clubs:

#### **Competitive Events**

Although the MSA has decided to implement a cautious resumption of some motor sport events the A.R.C. Council continues to strongly recommend that Member Clubs consider very carefully whether or not to recommence competitive activity. Member Clubs and their members should continue to avoid any green laning activity anywhere in the country.

The Government has classified the entire country into three types of designated area these being either, "Infected areas" (IA), "At Risk Areas" (ARA) and "Potentially at Risk Area" (PRA).

Earlier this month, the MSA announced that it will grant a permit for an off road event in a PRA if the event is organized on a non-agricultural site (such as a quarry or woodland). This includes trials (CCV, RTV and TYRO), Winch/Team Recoveries, promotional events, off-road gymkhanas,

point-to-point events and Competitive Safaris. **Any requirements from MAFF or the Landowner must be adhered to. Clubs seeking a permit should ensure events are closed to club to prevent potential transmission as the MSA's position on permits is based on events taking place at a single venue where there are no livestock present.**

Any club members living in infected areas should carefully consider whether or not to attend events. The government has issued advice to persons living in such areas, especially those working with livestock, about disinfection measures to be undertaken before they leave their home premises and on their return. This advice can be found on the MAFF website at [www.maff.gov.uk/animalh/diseases/fmd/leaflets/factsht4.pdf](http://www.maff.gov.uk/animalh/diseases/fmd/leaflets/factsht4.pdf). No doubt club committees with infected areas within their membership area will wish to take the potential risks of transmission into account when considering whether or not to resume competitive events.

### **Caravan Permits**

Advice has been received from ACCEO (Association of Camping and Caravanning Exempted Organisations) as to the circumstances in which member organisations should grant permits for camping/caravanning activities. Essentially Clubs wishing to obtain a permit will need to complete a risk assessment based on a simple questionnaire. This seeks information about the land type, proximity of FMD infected areas, presence of footpaths, permission of land owner, views of MAFF and the conduct of the event itself include the control of dogs and the disposal of waste food etc.

The A.R.C. Council has concluded that a resumption of camping and caravan rallies can take place, if there appears to be a minimal risk in so doing. It is suggested each Club rally should be individually assessed at Committee level. Your Club secretary will be provided with a model questionnaire to assist in making these risk assessments.

### **A.R.C. Vehicle Regulations- Rule Change Proposals 2001**

A.R.C. Council also carefully considered the proposed rule changes voted upon at the AGM on 17<sup>th</sup> March. **With the exception of four of the proposed rule changes**, which could not be ratified due to potential misinterpretation, all other changes were ratified. The four proposed rule changes which will be referred back to their originators for suggested amendment and possible resubmission for next year were proposals for Competitive Safari vehicle classes (4) and (5) and proposals relating to a change to the rule on welding and steering (14) and seat belt mounting (17b).


