Competition Secretary's Update

May is here and it's getting hotter (I hope it is as I write this article in Mid April)

Wedgehill Rally

We have just had our Easter Rally and all things taken into account it went very well.

Firstly I must thank all those who helped run the activities over the weekend for all there efforts and time particularly Neil Tomlinson who stood in for two vital roles on the Sunday and the Monday as well as setting out the RTV course on the Saturday.

The Tyro trial which was run by John Jennings and myself was taxing and enjoyable, however I was surprised to get only 4 entries for a full 8 Section trial (2 of these entries turned up late). We were somewhat lucky that we ran this event on the setting out day for the RTV otherwise we would have made a £150 loss on this one event alone.

As such I have agreed with the Chairman that we cant get the Club into this position at Tyro events again and hence can members please contact me at least 1 week prior to the event to advise me of their attendance. The event was eventually won by a Richard Salter in his 200 TDI 90 - on just 9 points (He cleared 7 sections on zero)

Richard showed some good composure during the event and will no doubt be progressing onto RTV in the near future (potentially one to watch out for as he could be very good)

Simon Birkby also had a good day and seemed to enjoy his 1st event in his V8 110 and eventually finished on 30 points. (Well done)

The ladies contest was eventually won by Sarah Bridger on 15points beating Maureen Keen into second on 39 points. (Both ladies seemed to enjoy their day)

There has to be one word of caution however with both John and I setting out the course --- we have some many years of setting out RTV trials and sometimes what we regard as straightforward is not.

It is quite difficult to set out a course that is not damaging or difficult to remember and as such we ask for a few TYRO drivers to come forward and help set out, this should help keep a balanced view on the event.

The RTV on Sunday saw 14 entries with 2 classes (class 4 &10 were amalgamated)

This was my first day off over the weekend so I was there as Scrutineer only (only one noted vehicle with poor rear recovery points (what no spreader plate) and worn out Panhard bushes) I wont name you Russell (Dam)

The other point of interest whilst Scrutineering is short term memory loss.

Our SRs were published in P&B not so long ago so why is it the throttle return spring question still getting raised? (The reason we need to fit it is as an MSA club its in the blue book. The committee took the view it was a safety regulation and hence we wrote it into our SRs)

The Club only driving day was only attended by 10 drivers but was well run and enjoyed by those souls who turned up. Technical stuff---

We recently went through the Diff locker debate with a few of our members. ARB type air actuate lockers can be fitted but must be disarmed to the discretion of the Scrutineer (See page 71 of 2002 ARC green book item B16)

Lowered suspension mounts on coil sprung vehicles are going to be allowed to compete in class 10 from now on

In the event of dispute over a score in an event the route of complaint is as follows. (More detail is given in the green book)

See COC and address the issue directly with him or her immediately. (The COC has the power to offer a re-run or overturn the score) (An over turn of the score is very rare). If you are still unhappy you may see the Steward, in the event of no steward please contact the comp sec who will act as the steward and act as the judge of fact. If you are still unhappy with this ruling you may in writing and with the correct fee take the issue to the ARC SORC. (You must state that this what you intend to do before prize giving) (Prize giving cannot take place if the potential overturn would change the positions) (This action must be taken up through the Steward)

Please remember that if you have an issue with a section you have the right to raise it with the COC prior to any competitors starting the section (i.e. that branch is dangerous can we remove it???)

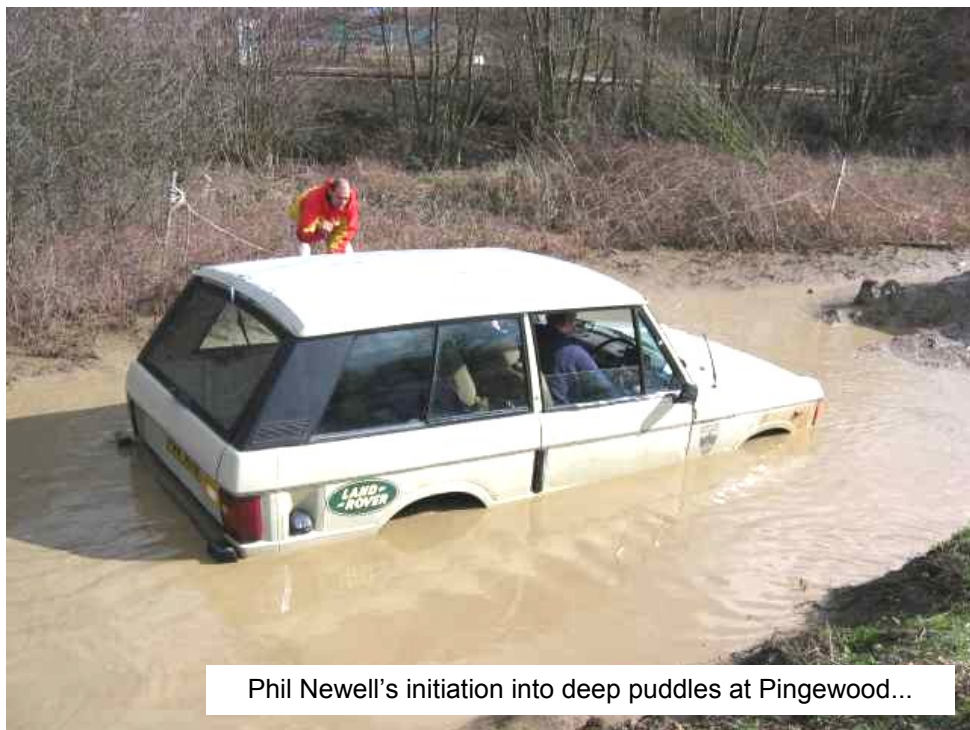
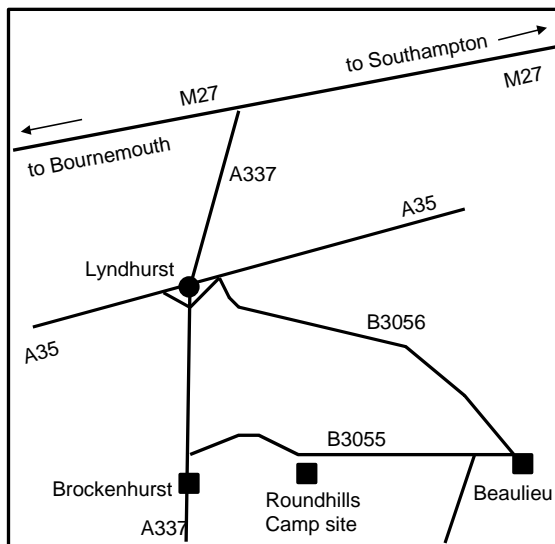


Social Side. (2)

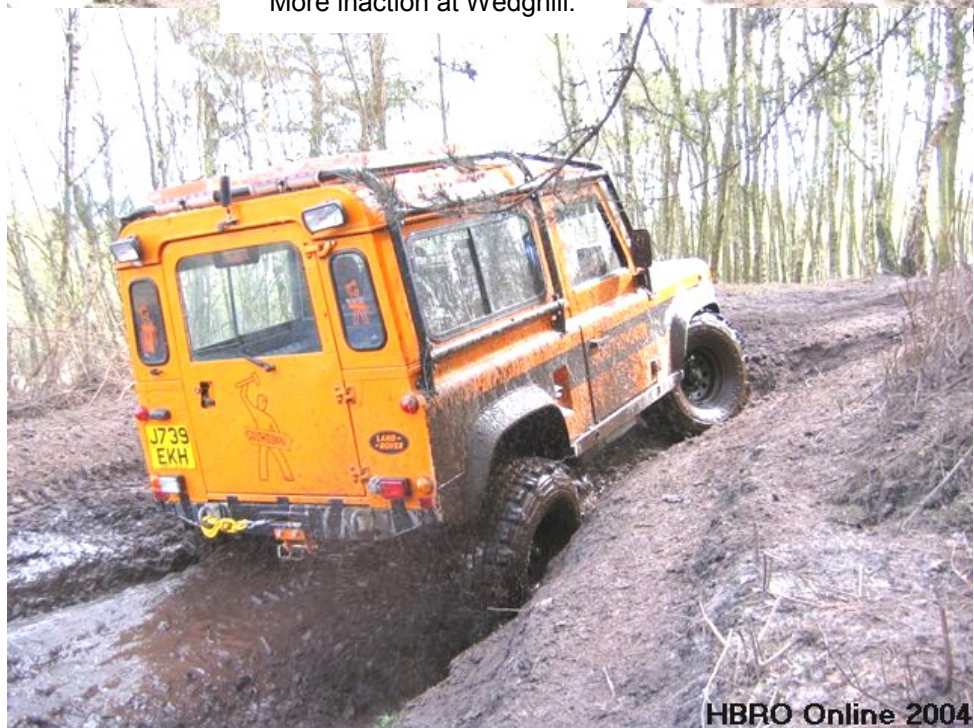

Tyro Trial Interesting Points

Tyro is LATIN and means Novice or Beginner, NOT -----TIP YOUR ROVER OVER

MSA rules on Tyro -----

Max side slope 25%

Max incline 50%

NO MODS REQUIRED----- However our Club SRs state throttle return spring and suitable front and rear recovery points (These are HBRO Rules not MSA or ARC but we consider them a safety point and as such they are mandatory at HBRO events)

Sections should be laid out in a manner for all classes to compete with minimal risk of damage (Freelander, Series 1,2,3, 109, 90,110, 101, Discovery and Range Rover are the classes of vehicle that must be catered for when setting out)

I hope this clarifies a few points

Belgium National 2004

The Belgium national is upon us again. The dates for this year's event are 17th – 19th September and the HBRO name will be represented. I went along for the first time last year with Max Bob and we had a good crack, we are both going back this year.

So far we have 4 motors in the XX-trem class for the 2004 event and we would like to get some more of you lot involved. You don't necessarily have to do the XX-trem if you wanted something a little less extreme you could try Adventurer or X-trem.

- Costs for the event at an estimate are £230 or 315€ entry fee for XX-trem. (This includes entry to the event for 2 adults, breakfast and dinner, packed lunches on 3 days and I think a welcome drink was included last year too. More this 2 or 3 actually.) Should you want to fill you Landy with more family you will pay 85€ for over 10's and 45€ for under 10's.
- An additional payment of £85 as a guarantee, so that you don't do anything naughty. (Nick assures me that HBRO have never had a guarantee cheque cashed before now.)
- Ferry crossing from Dover to Dunkirk normally. This is also something Nick handles, and for the past 3 years has got a good return crossing price.
- Then you get into Beer, Additional food (for people like me) Fuel and lots of it, general bits and bobs that may take your fancy and more Beer.

The camping is good, showers and Toilets are ok too (Along as they don't empty them @ 3am again). The packed lunch will keep you alive, but I found the breakfast and dinner ok (I am quite fussy too) the beer is good, not too expensive either.

Booking is done on the website @ www.belgium-national.com. It's not too helpful info wise, but it looks ok.
